CONFIRMATION SUNDAY

MAY 1

42 YOUNG PEOPLE ARE EXCITED ABOUT CONFIRMATION DAY AND BECOMING FULL MEMBERS OF OUR SHANDON CHURCH FAMILY.

Throughout the Confirmation experience, God has moved in so many ways, and these youth have a much deeper sense of what it means to be in a caring committed community of faith. The congregation is encouraged to support them with our prayers and presence at the 11:00 a.m. Traditional service. Their names and their mentors will be listed in the worship bulletin.

It's more than spiritual homework.

In case you missed it, first, our worship time over five weeks focused on individual reflection, with an eye on what qualities we find in someone who is wholly devoted to Christ. We concluded that being in the making as a follower of Jesus requires:

- **Ownership**, since this life must be an intentional choice.
- **Obedience**, which is our means of saying "Yes," to Jesus day by day.
- **Humble Creativity**, as we relinquish our pride yet realize the special insight that God gives us.
- **Initiative**, in the form of an active, involved response to God's grace.
- **Sacrifice**, as we repent from the world in favor of God's kingdom.

But that's not all. As much as that individual picture of our personal spiritual health is in-depth, and challenging, during the campaign we also confessed that the way we live our discipleship together as a community is critical. So, secondly, in Sunday school, we centered on the idea that an effective disciple-making group covenants together to:

- Experience the Word.
- Watch over one another in love.
- Work out our salvation in devotion.
- Work out our salvation in service.
- Bear witness to Christ.

And that brings us to today. For many of us, as individuals and classes, maybe it brings us to a sense of "What's next?" After all, the campaign, and those two "lists of five," are meant to be more than a kind of spiritual homework assignment to have completed swiftly and superficially in order to earn an "A+" with God. So, what will we do with it all?

The truth is, the answer to that is entirely up to us as a congregation, as individual disciples and disciple-making groups. Maybe instead of a general "What's next?" I'd like to leave you with this question: will we be in the making as disciples of Christ? Will we recommit ourselves to weekly worship (yes, even in the summertime!), or find and become active in a disciple-making group? Will we treat these qualities and covenant principles as a guide toward the kind of Christian life that we were created for, that we all hunger and thirst for, and that we are capable of really pursuing by God's grace?

I pray so, and look forward to doing it alongside you,

Reminder of the Month: Line of Sight Rule

Two or more adults should be present during any church sponsored program involving children or youth. When two of these adults are related, another unrelated adult should be present. One adult should not be alone with a single child or youth, including in vehicles participating in church activities.

Copies of Policy Key Points, Reporting Procedures, and Report Forms, as well as a list of approved volunteer workers, are in wall slots in halls and areas where children are cared for.
