Take the Long View

Christians are considered to be very nearsighted.

We only see what is up close. We seldom see beyond the four cozy walls of the church or beyond our present situation. Additionally, Christians are sometimes characterized as people with little or no peripheral vision. There is no breadth or long look.

However, I prefer the people of God to be known for our farsightedness, always focusing on the next step ahead, always looking ten to fifteen years into the future, always keeping in mind the next generation.

Disciples of our Lord take very seriously the “here and the now.” But we also take the long look. We take the long look in the spirit of two verses from Psalm 49:13-14: “...That you may tell the next generation that this is God, our God forever and ever.”

I do not know what the rest of the 21st century will be like but I am convinced that Christian discipleship will play a vital role. I am convinced that people will need God just as you and I need God today. And I am convinced the church will continue to play a vital role in people’s lives, in our communities and in our world.

However, those who are looking into the future of the church tell us that churches in the future will have a greater challenge funding their ministry. For this reason we at Shandon are now planning a greater emphasis on the Shandon United Methodist Foundation. We have an initial goal to grow the principle in our foundation to at least \$5 million and to use earnings from these invested funds to fund parts of Shandon’s ministry in the future. For instance our foundation is divided in two sections one for missions and one for property upkeep. Members can choose which section to direct their gifts.

Anyone can make a gift to our Foundation at any time. We also expect some of the gifts to come from the wills and estates of our members. Therefore, when you plan your will we ask that you remember Shandon UMC. That way your gifts can support and uphold the church long after you have died.

I encourage us all take the long view and make sure we are supporting Shandon’s Foundation through regular gifts which should always be over and beyond our gifts to the operating budget or through our wills and estates.

I look forward to seeing you on Sunday morning as we gather for worship and study.

On a recent rainy Sunday morning, the entire length of the outer curb had cars parked in the NO PARKING / FIRE LANE zone. There were places where it was “tight” for a normal car to negotiate. **Why does the Fire Department require us to have a FIRE LANE? Will our neglect of the FIRE LANE cause any harm or even lives be lost? What if someone has an emergency,** say a heart attack or stroke where every second counts and an ambulance can not get around the building as designed and has to turn around to approach from Adger Street?

These are all appropriate questions we as a church family need to address together. While we wish we could provide up-close parking to everyone, especially on rainy days, we MUST obey the city requirements. The Fire Department says that if they need to come through there during an emergency, they will get their fire truck through one way or the other. I personally do not want to explain to my insurance company why my vehicle was parked in the FIRE LANE. We are not sure if either the church’s insurance policy or your auto insurance will cover this risk.

The Property Committee is politely asking that everyone obey the NO PARKING, FIRE LANE from this date forward. Our parking lot across Devine Street normally has parking spaces available and we pay for the crossing guard to assist with safely crossing the street on Sunday mornings. Thank you for your help and consideration.
