Your Voice – God's Mission

I hope you are being blessed by the devotions you are reading each day and the focus on prayer as part of our 30 day season of prayer.

I know I am. I am beginning to think about Shandon's ministry from God's perspective instead of my own. Too often we become possessive about the church and want to do things our way. It is good to remember that it is God's church. Sunday afternoon, I gathered with our confirmands to practice for confirmation Sunday, April 10. I went over the service we will use, and I was impressed again with the introduction to the service. It is found on page 45 of our hymnal and the introduction reads as follows:

"The church is of God, and will be preserved to the end of time, for the conduct of worship and the due administration of God's Word and Sacraments, the maintenance of Christian fellowship and discipline, the edification of believers, and the conversion of the world. All, of every age and station, stand in need of the means of grace which it alone supplies."

It is God's church and God has given the church its mission. For that reason, it is good to think about what God wants for his church. Let's keep reading our devotions and praying for Shandon each day that God might give us discernment regarding our future ministry.

Our strategic planning process allows you to have a voice regarding our church's future ministry as God guides you. I hope you will take advantage of this opportunity. You will have an opportunity to voice where you think we need to become more effective in ministry, suggest new arenas for ministry, and identify issues we need to address.

It is God's church but he calls us to be involved in carrying out the church's ministry. Make sure you are present at a listening group. I look forward to seeing you Sunday morning at church school and worship!!
