world without
Malaria.*

Malaria is a life-threatening disease transmitted through the bite of the female anopheles mosquito. In Sub-Saharan African, a person dies every two minutes from Malaria and 90 percent of malaria's victims are children under the age of five. Malaria is the number-one reason for school absences worldwide. Currently Malaria kills nearly 600,000 people a year. Thankfully the death toll has decreased four-fold when a child would die since 2010

because of the work of the *Imagine No Malaria* campaign by the United Methodist Churches. However, any loss of life is too much. The good news is malaria is 100 percent treatable, beatable, and preventable. Our hope and goal is through the *Imagine No Malaria* campaign to eradicate malaria by 2044.

Many of you have heard me speak about Susan and Joel. Susan and I went to college together and now Susan lives in Malawi as a teacher. Since moving to Malawi, Susan has adopted a little boy named Joel. Joel is now 20-months-old and is a healthy and happy active little boy. However, I imagine many of Susan's nights are spent staying up and thinking about the health and safety of Joel. Malawi has an incredibly high rate of Malaria especially currently during the rainy season. Susan does everything she can to keep Joel safe and prevent him from being exposed to any mosquito bites. Joel and Susan constantly wear mosquito repellent, and Joel sleeps under a mosquito net daily. Susan tried to put Joel on anti-Malaria medication but the side effects were too much to bear.

Susan and Joel's story is just one person's story of living with the reality of malaria. I pray and hope that one day we will live in a world without malaria. However, this will take more than prayers, we must put our money where our mouth is.

Our Bishop has challenged the South Carolina conference to raise 1 million dollars this year for *Imagine No Malaria*. In order to raise 1 million dollars as a conference, each individual congregation needs to raise 12 dollars per member. During the season of Lent, our children ages four through sixth grade, raised over 1,800 dollars. Let us be inspired by our little ones to give and give generously.
