Discerning What to Give

Commitment Sunday for our capital campaign will be May 5.

During April each of us must discern what we will give. Remember our commitment to the campaign is to be over and beyond what we are currently giving to the operating budget and we will have three years to complete our commitment. So how do we discern what to give? Let me suggest to you the seven step process Winni and I will be using at our house.

- 1. Pray** – since God is the ultimate giver of all that we have, we need to make this decision in conversation with God. So we should begin seeking God’s direction in daily prayer. Remember effective prayer is not just talking to God but also listening to God.
- 2. Read the Scriptures** – Let me suggest a few: I Chronicles 29:11-12, 14-16, Luke 6:38, Matthew 6:19-21, Deuteronomy 16:17, II Corinthians 8:12.
- 3. Reevaluate concepts of giving, acquiring, and ownership.**
- 4. Count your blessings** – make a list of every blessing you have received from God. Celebrate God’s generosity to you.
- 5. Pray some more** – really listen to what God is directing you to give by opening your mind, heart and soul to God.
- 6. Consider sacrifice** – What could I give up or do without in order to make a generous commitment to the campaign. In previous campaigns one family in our church delayed irrigating their yard so they could give a generous gift and another family waited a few more years to purchase a new car.
- 7. Obey God**

Winni and I will be following this process during April, we hope you will too. Let’s join together and make Blessed to Serve: Debt Free and Mission Forward a great campaign. Let’s retire our church’s debt and do a great new thing for God through the Family Shelter.
