Gumption and Heart

Many in our world seem to have bought in to the idea that this is a closed world in which everything is slowly running down. So you better grab what you can.

During the past several years we have heard much about a downturn in the economy. We have heard dozens of times that the two emotions that drive the stock market are greed and fear. Both of these are fundamentally attitudes of scarcity.

As far as the problems in the world we see them as part of a closed world too. Too little housing? It's just the downside of the economy, can't help it. Hunger? You'll never solve that, too big a problem. Crime? What can really be done about that?

If our world is a place where nothing new can happen then Jesus must be still buried in the tomb. Therefore, we can enjoy our capital gains and not feel the need to be generous in a world where millions are barely surviving, we can keep being promiscuous with whomever comes along, and we can keep giving great attention to our material needs verses our spiritual needs and we can ignore problems like poverty and crime.

But if Jesus is raised from the dead, then all bets are off. Easter is not simply a metaphor for new life. It isn't about the return of Robins and Daffodils in the spring. Easter declares that the God who created heaven and earth is capable of creating a new heaven and earth. Taking the broken pieces and closed tombs of our world and making them something new.

If Christ is raised from the dead we can't stay stuck in our little tombs anymore. We can't let tough problems define us: a broken relationship, the loss of a loved one, a habitual sin, injustice and human need.

As William Sloan Coffin once put it, "Christ is risen to convert us, not from life to something more than life, but from something less than life to the possibility of full life itself. Christ's resurrection, he says, promises to put love in our hearts, decent thoughts in our heads and a little more iron in our spines."

Easter calls us to new life. New life in which we find courage to make that move at work we've been afraid to make, gumption to face up to what is happening at home, grace to rise above our sins, and a heart that still cares for the world around us and a stiff spine to do something about it.

So relish the Easter enthusiasm. Come and worship Sunday morning. Go into the world to make the difference you were intended to make!

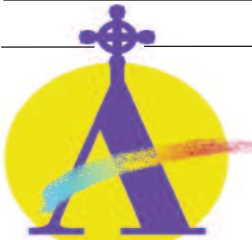

COMMUNITY GARDENS–

A Way Of Helping People To Get Back To Tending The Soil!

For thousands of years communities gathered to cultivate the land for food and celebrate its harvest. This vital part of community collaboration has all but disappeared.

In Omaha, Nebraska, the “Big Garden” was born in 2006 – one of the most extensive garden projects in the country. The project was started by the United Methodist Ministries and the United Methodist Church. The Big Garden sought to develop food producing urban gardens in the impoverished neighborhoods of the city. Respect for the land was a central component. The project teaches organic gardening, education on composting and water conservation, and health and diet education.

The City of Columbia as part of its Let's Move Campaign has established community gardens at different locations within the city to promote healthier lifestyles. The city provides the soil, compost and water for a 5x12 foot plot for \$20 a year. Thank you City of Columbia for helping people get back to tending the soil!
