CHARGING OR STOPPING?

A couple of lumberjacks were hard at work. One was an older gentleman and the other was a young guy. The younger one said to the old man, "I bet I can cut more logs than you can today." The older one replied, "I bet you can't."

So they went to battle. They set a four-hour time limit, and raced to see who could cut the most logs in the time allotted.

The young man went after it, and he did not stop the entire four hours. When he was finished he had a pile of logs.

Along the way, every thirty or forty minutes, he'd notice the old man was taking a break for a little while. He thought to himself, that old man's getting tired, and he can't keep up with me. I know I will win. But when the four hours were up, the young man could not believe his eyes. The old man had cut twice as many logs as he had.

He looked at him in disbelief, and said, "How in the world did you do that? You kept stopping so often. The old man replied, "I was sharpening my axe."

So many people today resemble that young man, just charging through life. But that is not the most effective way to live our lives. If we can learn to take time every so often to "sharpen our axes," to draw strength from God, to have our outlook refined by God's wisdom, to enhance our faith, and to remember the importance of loving one another, there is no telling how much richer our life's experience would be.

I remember some years ago we woke up on Sunday morning to three inches of snow on the ground and about an inch on the roads. It was one of those surprise snows that are not forecasted. It was too late to cancel church so we decided to hold service for those who might come. I arrived at church and opened the doors and a few folks came. Most of them were older adults. I told them I was surprised that they of all people would come out in the snow. They said, "If the doors of the church are opened we will be here." One said, "I made a commitment early in my life that I would attend church regularly so if you have worship I will be here." These folks knew the importance of "sharpening their axes."

Summer is almost over. School begins again next week. Let's realize our need to keep our axes sharpened and plan to be in worship and Sunday school every Sunday. That way we can live the most meaningful and fulfilled life possible.
