Releasing the Seeds

I read a story about how monkeys are captured in the wild.

First of all, the people start with a gourd and put a small hole in the top of it. Then they place seeds in the hole in the top and tie the gourd to a stake in the ground. The monkey comes along and smells seeds and since the hole is big enough for his hand, he reaches inside. But when he grasps the seeds and closes his fist, he can't get it out.

Do you know what happens? The monkey won't let go of the seeds. All he has to do is release what is in his hand and he can be free. But he won't. He'll continue to hang on to those seeds, even until people come and capture him.

The truth is anything we hold that tightly is certain to trap us sooner or later. That is certainly true of money.

I once heard a story about a minister who had a distraught man come to him one day. He had been making \$20,000 and had been tithing his salary. But his business had picked up big time and his salary had jumped to \$150,000. So he said to his pastor, "I don't know what to do, because a tithe of \$150,000 would simply be too much."

Do you know how the pastor responded? He said, "Let's pray that God will reduce your salary back to \$20,000, when you could really acknowledge who He was."

Money can change us and not always in a good way. Fortunately, we always have the choice to open up our fists and let our giving change us first. Paul wrote in his letter to Timothy:

"Tell those who are rich in this world not to be proud and not to trust their money, which will soon be gone. But their trust should be in the living God."

The question remains: Are we going to be like those monkeys who stick their hands in the gourds and refuse to let go? Or are we releasing the seeds in our hands. Our opportunities on earth to do great things for God go by so quickly. Who are we then not to give all we can and lay up treasure in heaven.

I look forward to seeing you Sunday morning as our church family gathers at church. It won't be as good as it can be without you!!

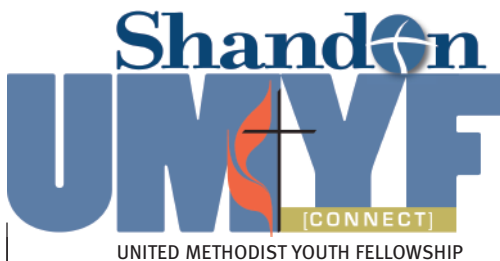
