My first official day of June 26th is at a one-month anniversary. All our moving boxes are unpacked. The dog has finally quit howling from all the transition. And my schedule holds dates into the next few months. Time moves so quickly, does it not?

August is also quickly shaping up to hold new classes and meetings with hopes of a future built together of serving God and living the faithful life that God has called us to live. This is time well-spent of learning, growing, and deepening our connection with God and with each other.

I am also reminded in all the hurry of moving, settling and working to reacquaint myself often with the presence of God. Sitting and depthfully praying and listening for God to speak or nudge is a practice that is near and dear to my heart. Yet in a season of much transition, it can be a challenge to manage even when it is all the more vital.

The Desert Mothers and Fathers, and other monastics, have often referred to their vocation as a vocation of prayer. What would it be to us to consider with absolute humility a vocation of prayer in our lives even as we are not monastics? Christianity is forever offering things to do and while acts of mercy and charity are truly honorable and must never be discounted – listening to God intentionally in that sweet hour of prayer is an act of piety that informs our being as well as our doing.

We all have our own vocation. Or maybe we have even retired. Even so, might we take up the bi-vocational pursuit of what it is that we do and then who it is that we are before God: A child listening intently for God to speak? A beloved child of God relishing the presence of God's love? A confessed and humbled sinner yearning for the Holy Spirit to breath anew into tired lungs? If you can add another vocation to the one you already have, might it be good for your soul to add the vocation of prayer?

Prayer is so often my safe place. It is in the quiet shared with God that I can actually manage to answer the question that John Wesley asked so long ago: "How goes it with your soul?" Until I sit with God in prayer, I realize I can't even comment on the status of my soul. I might be able to comment on the status of my doing, but not my soul. Serving and being will always be connected and so may our serving be informed by our living depthfully in prayer.

May God's presence bless you as you continue forward in beautiful acts of mercy and piety. – Shannon

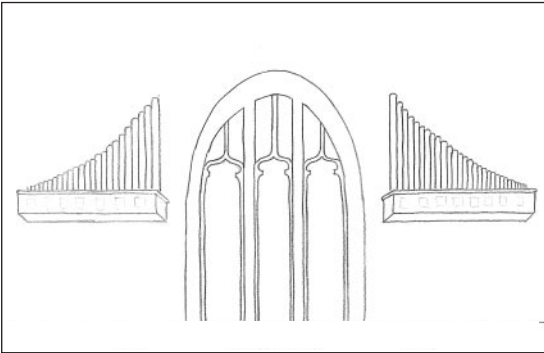

ANTIPHONAL INSTALLATION

Sanctuary Organ

DURING THE SUMMER OF 2020, WE WILL BE INSTALLING AN ANTIPHONAL DIVISION TO OUR "MOLLER ORGAN."

During the summer of 2020, we will be installing an antiphonal division to our Moller Organ. The antiphonal pipework will be located in the balcony on either side of the Resurrection Window. Consisting of seven ranks, (approximately 427 pipes) the new division will be playable from the console located in the choir loft. The work is being done by Daniel Angerstein, of Hendersonville, NC. Mr. Angerstein was also the tonal finisher of the organ during the 1994 refurbishment, and we are pleased that he will be installing the antiphonal division. The work will also include new digital stops, electronic upgrades to the console, and the entire organ will be cleaned. Many thanks to Shandon member, Patricia Beckler, for a generous gift to make this work possible. Also, thanks to George Stone, for the artist rendering of the antiphonal division.
