Finishing the Right Thing

Do you read every book you purchase? I have to admit that I haven't read a page out a few books on my bookshelf. Do you meet the goal for every diet you begin?

When you set a goal to exercise more do you really do it or do you give up after a few days? How about that exercise machine you bought, do you use it? Every spring a lot of us buy flowers and are motivated to fertilize and plant. Do you maintain the gardens you plant?

It is OK not to finish everything we begin and not to complete every goal we set for ourselves. My desire in this article is not to convince you that you should finish everything you begin. But my desire is to convince you to finish the right thing. Certain goals are optional other goals are essential. Consider this admonition from the writer of Hebrews when he writes about the race of faith, "Let us run the race before us and never give up."

When we look at Jesus' life we notice his best work was his final work and his strongest steps were his last steps. The writer of Hebrews goes on to say that Jesus, "held on while wicked people were doing evil things to him." The implication is that Jesus could have quit the race. But he didn't. He held on while evil people were doing wicked things to him.

Let's consider the race of faith and see how we are doing. When we joined the church we promised, "according to the grace given us to keep God's holy will and commandments and walk in the same all the days of our lives." Is that goal still before us every day as we live our lives?

We stated that we "believe in God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit." Does this belief motivate us and nurture us as we run the race of faith?

We promised to "be loyal to the church and uphold it by our prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness." Wow that's a lot and it is all important! God needs us to keep his church strong and effective in ministry. How are we doing?

How about the vow we took when our children were baptized? "...to raise them in a Christian home and under the guidance and ministry of the church." Are we making sure our children grow up with a strong and vital faith?

These few things are not all there is to running the race of faith, but they are the heart of it. How are we doing?

The goal is to complete the race and hear God say, "Well done good and faithful servant."

I look forward to seeing all of you as we gather Sunday morning and continue running the race together.

Our adult choirs include the Chancel Choir, Celebration Choir and Wesley Ringers.

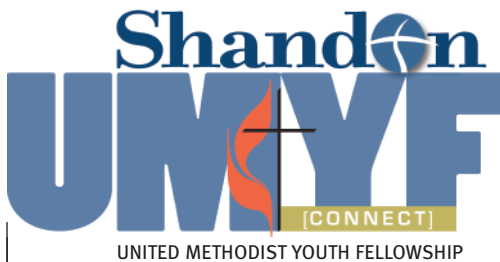
- **Chancel Choir** sings each Sunday and rehearses on Wednesdays from 7:15-8:45 p.m.

Currently, Aldersgate has two homes for adults with developmental disabilities, where a trained, dedicated and professional staff provides loving care in a safe environment.

A growing need in South Carolina requires additional services from Aldersgate, which seeks to expand its ministry with investments of time, energy and money. To help celebrate this ten year milestone, Aldersgate asks members and churches for their prayers and support of this ministry. Shandon's Child & Youth Abuse Prevention Procedures Reminder of the Month:

"Requirements Prior to Working with Children & Youth"
Before working with children or youth, all volunteer church workers must:

- Be a Shandon member or actively involved at Shandon for at least six months.
- Attend a training session and sign a statement that they have been trained, have read, understand, and will abide by this Policy and the Procedures to Reduce Risk and Abuse for both children and youth.
- Pass a National Background Check, a Social Security Verification Check, and a SLED criminal records check. Rechecks will be every three years.
- Complete and sign a Volunteer Application, listing three non-related references.

Copies of Policy Key Points, Reporting Procedures, and Report Forms, as well as a list of approved volunteer workers, are in wall slots in halls and areas designated for children and youth.
