Love the Church Too Much?

Dwindling membership and attendance is an issue heard from many mainline denominations. The membership of the United Methodist Church in the U.S. last gained an increase in membership in 1965.

However, the UMC is growing in parts of the world such as on the continent of Africa, it is growing in the Southeastern Jurisdiction of the UMC and Shandon continues to see membership growth year in and year out.

Dr. Gil Rendle, our Keynote speaker at Annual Conference, pointed out that in the U.S. the UMC has seen a membership decline since 1965 from 11 million members to 7 million members today. He also pointed out the average age of a United Methodist has risen from 35 to 59 since 1965.

He pointed out that we are working harder and longer at doing the same things we have been doing for years, and we are seeing that the results do not bring greater membership and attendance and more people accepting the grace and forgiveness of Jesus Christ.

Many of us have lived in a culture following WWII where going to church was a way of life. We knew on Sunday that we were supposed to attend Sunday school and worship. Today, it is a different story, a different culture and a different set of circumstances. Worship used to draw people to church. Today, mission draws the younger generation to church. Dr. Rendle said, "The younger generation is saying if I am to know Jesus it somehow must change my life. They are willing to commit to church as long as they see results. They want to see in action what it means to be part of a Christian fellowship. They don't want to just sit and listen. They want to feel "changed" and they want to use this change to make a positive difference in the culture around them."

A new younger generation is emerging. How can the church relate to them and make the gospel relevant to them? That's the question we the church must address. Dr. Rendle asks the question, "Can we love the church too much?" Too much that we are unwilling to make the necessary changes to reach the younger generation. Too much that we don't do the necessary work in order to reach them. Too much that we just maintain status quo?

Our church staff and some of our church committees are beginning to address these questions. We must address them if the church is going to have an exciting future. May Almighty God guide us as we address the challenges and opportunities the church is facing.

I look forward to seeing you Sunday morning as we gather at the table of our Lord for Holy Communion in all three worship services. In Faith, Michael Guffee

October 3: Face It – Often the first reaction of survivors in a “wilderness” might be to pretend that everything is normal or okay. So, one of the first steps towards a life pursuing mindset is to take a close look at stark reality, the good and not so good parts of everyday life.
October 10: Focus – Even as survivors come to grips with the reality of their circumstances, other stimuli – distractions, side-tracks or “rabbit holes” – can cloud their judgment or delay their progress towards making it out alive. This is when it’s time to reorient, reprioritize, and regain the path that will lead us to a peace-full life.
October 17: Don’t Freak Out – Now that survivors are attuned to the task that’s before them, the weight of their predicament can start to bear down. It can be easy to let anxiety about the uncertain road ahead sink in. But this is also the time to turn panic into resolve – to let the fullness of recognizing the situation wash over us and still to be okay to move on.

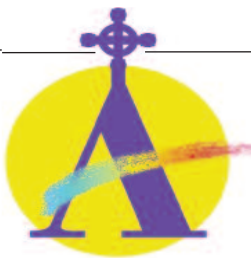
