Change for Growth

Several weeks ago Frances Tompkins e-mailed me some inspirational information about eagles. I liked it so much I shared it with our staff for my devotion this morning and I want to share it with you. The author is unknown.

The eagle has the longest life-span among birds. It can live up to 70 years. But in order to reach this age, the eagle has to go through several transitions. In its 40s, its long and flexible talons can no longer grab prey for food to sustain the eagle. Its long and sharp beak becomes bent. Its heavy wings, due to the thickness of its feathers, become stuck to its chest and make it difficult to fly.

Then the eagle is left with two options: die or go through a painful process of change which lasts 150 days. The process requires the eagle to fly to a mountain top and sit on its nest. There the eagle knocks its beak against a rock until it comes out. After plucking it out, the eagle will wait for a new beak to grow back and then will pluck out its talons. When its talons grow back, it will pluck out its old-aged feathers. After five months, the eagle takes its famous flight of rebirth and lives for 30 more years.

There are multiple applications to this story. It certainly speaks to those times in life when we have to make a transition and it helps us to understand that transitions and change are necessary for growth. We sometimes need to get rid of old memories, habits and past traditions. Only freed from the past can we take advantage of the future.

I think the story speaks to us as a congregation. Our church is 100 years old. But sometimes even the church needs to change in order to embrace the future.

Our Vision Team, lead by Mark Tidsworth, has been working on our strategic plan faithfully since May. In September, we will unveil the plan. The plan is going to be challenging, it will require some change, it will mean doing some things differently and it will mean taking on some new things as well. But this will be necessary to claim God's future. We began our process of strategic planning with a 30-day season of prayer. We believe God is guiding us into the future. Let's be willing to change in order to claim God's future for Shandon United Methodist.

I look forward to seeing each of you Sunday morning.
