Just Do It

What can we say about prayer that has not already been said? Maybe the answer to that lies in the answer a minister gave to a parishioner when asked for advice on fasting... "We don't need teaching on it, we just need to do it," he replied.

Jesus taught his disciples to pray. They asked, "Teach us to pray, Master," and he did. Notice, they never asked him to "teach us to how to pray." The saint knows he needs the Holy Spirit for that. We need to make two points here: a Christian prays because he must, she has to do it. Nothing will point out the sovereignty of God to the human heart like a person in prayer. Through praying God's sovereignty becomes known. More knowledge of God is learned in the utterance, "O, Lord God in heaven," than in a thirty minute sermon.

Secondly, not only is prayer the mark of a disciple, but prayer is also the mark of a brave heart. A brave man prays. Look at Moses at the Red Sea, Joshua at Jericho, Daniel in the lion's den, Mary and Martha at the grave of their brother and Jesus in the Garden of Gethsemane. They are brave men and women, not cowards. A coward will do nothing usually. He or she is a coward when they do not pray. They lack courage to face God and rely on God.

This brings me to a third point: prayer is nakedness before God. Adam and Eve were naked before God. When we pray we lay ourselves bare before God. There is one place where we can totally be honest with ourselves and with God and that is in prayer. Then as we receive God's gifts of love, acceptance, strength, forgiveness, courage and grace in prayer we are clothed in praise for all God's good gifts to us. The world does not understand praise. Praise is from another country. Praise follows us back to earth after we have prayed and that might be one of the greatest gifts of prayer. It reveals to us the glory of God.

Therefore let me encourage you to pray and to pray daily and often!!! See you Sunday at the praying place.

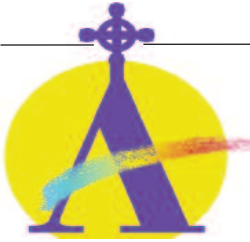

THE SHANDON UNITED METHODIST CHURCH FOUNDATION

was formed to better serve and manage the gifts given to Shandon from time to time by your fellow members, both living and from estates. Prior to the Foundation, endowment gifts to the church were individually set up as trust-type accounts and the investments individually managed. The church has seven such funds under investment management at this time.

The Foundation consists of two components:

- 1) The Property Endowment Fund is for the benefit of the physical plant and other property of the church;
- 2) The Missions Endowment Fund is designated for charitable, religious and educational purposes of the church. Within these guidelines there is flexibility for those making gifts to support special or designated projects, but gifts allowing the Trustees to designate utilization are especially useful.

Your Trustees serve as the governing board through an appointed five person Investments Committee.

Currently, committee members are: Jim Zeigler, Lou Watson, Dorothy Wardrip, LE Spradlin, and Ed Ringley.

Since inception, December 15, 1994, these Foundation Funds through gifts and investment growth have reached a value of over \$100,000 each. These are sizable funds, but to support the property and missions of a church our size, substantially more is needed.

Shandon has current and long-term physical and mission related needs. Funds for these purposes, from sources like these Foundation earnings, can be greatly increased through an even more successful Foundation program.

Over the next few months, the Investment Committee and other professional members of our church will bring you information on some of the benefits the church and the Shandon mission outreach can receive through a successful Foundation program.
