## CHURCH COUNCIL Approves Capital Campaign

*In August 2012 Shandon's Church Council, upon recommendation of the Finance Committee, voted to have a capital campaign in 2013 to raise \$2,000,000. The Council also voted to retain RSI Stewardship to be our consultants for the campaign.*

The purpose of the campaign is twofold. First, we need to retire our debt of \$1,275,000 on all previous building and renovation. Since construction ended in 2009 Shandon has paid interest only on our debt. We did this because our country was in a recession and we had a very favorable interest rate of less than 2 percent. However, in 2012 the bank came to us and indicated we would have to begin paying interest and principle in 2013. When the Finance Committee analyzed the effect of this they realized our yearly payout of approximately \$24,000 for interest only would be increased to approximately \$84,000 for interest and principle an increase of \$60,000. Concern that this increase would jeopardize our programs and ministry, the Finance Committee decided we need to pay off our debt and that a capital funds campaign was necessary.

A second purpose of the campaign is of a missional nature. Both the Finance Committee and the Church Council feel Shandon has been greatly blessed to be able to accomplish the improvements that have been made on our property through our building and renovation program. What we have been able to do and fund is really amazing. We have done \$8.5 million in building and renovation and improvements on our facilities, and our facilities are serving the mission and ministry of our church very well. Now is the time to show our gratitude to God by doing something for someone else. Church Council has voted that 25 percent of what we raise in our capital campaign will be given to the Family Shelter to assist them in building a communal living space with new kitchen and dining hall. The Family Shelter is the only homeless center that will take families in Columbia and it is also one of our church's signature ministries. During our campaign each of us will have an opportunity to learn much more about the Family Shelter.

Finally, the remainder raised in our capital campaign will be used to pay campaign expenses and fund our debt payments until the debt is retired in 2016.

Every time we have attempted a capital campaign we have succeeded because of the support and dedication of our church members. I am confident this time we will succeed again.

Please pray daily for our church as we proceed with this worthy effort.

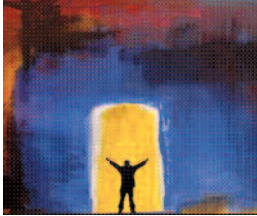

Since becoming pastor in 1992 of Bethel AME Church on Woodrow St., over 1, 900 people have joined this vibrant congregation. A new school on their campus, Bethel Learning Centers, was founded in 1995 with only one student and the Brailsford’s youngest son. Today it serves more than 300 children.

*The purpose of this series is to expand knowledge and understanding and to dialogue together in a spirit of peaceful and caring. After introductory remarks, our guests will respond to questions from the audience on foundations, leaders, doctrines and beliefs, worship practices, holy days, education, and expectations in one’s personal life and faith community. The leaders will draw from their own education, experience and beliefs, free from the impossible expectation that any one person can adequately present the rich diversity within any Faith. A Shandon minister will also be present.*
