Holy Laughter

From the Senior Minister

Jesus did not come to frighten us. He came to set us free.

The Puritans never did learn that, and unfortunately, the church has gotten most of her ideas of holiness from Puritans. But I think a holy person can be fun, lighthearted and it can be a joy to be in their company. I believe in the sovereignty of God. I believe in God's reverence and in his glory but I believe that a holy person can be fun, God is not a killjoy.

There is a light side to God. The Bible says so: "A merry heart doeth good like medicine," the writer of Proverb reminds us. "God hath made me to laugh," said Sarah; Jesus told those who weep, "Ye shall laugh." In Psalm 2:4 it says "God sits in the heavens and laughs." In the day and age in which we live the world needs a good sense of holy laughter.

We need to laugh. Not all the time, but some of the time. I have heard of hospitals playing Three Stooges movies to make their patients laugh. We have heard people say, "Don't take yourself too seriously." That's good advice, we should not take ourselves or our life's situation too seriously.

I think Jesus had a wonderful sense of humor. He talked about swallowing a camel, going through the eye of a needle. A few of his parables were dripping with humor. It is as if he were having fun with the people at the expense of heaven's engagement and their time. In his parables the unworthy become worthy and the seemingly worthy are seen as unworthy. As in the parable of the prodigal son where the prodigal is seen as worthy but the elder brother who stayed home and was loyal to father is seen as unworthy.

Somehow we must get holiness out of the cathedrals and back into the joy and mainstream of life. Jesus did. Don't take yourself or your problems too seriously. Humor can be found in almost any situation, look for it and laugh.

Columbia Baroque Soloists Concert "Orpheus in London"

Friday, January 28 in the Shandon Sanctuary

The Columbia Baroque Soloists will perform the early Baroque music that was performed in London when it was Baroque Europe's great musical capital.

The performance will feature the virtuosic music of two great Baroque composers, Henry Purcell and George Frideric Handel, both referred to as the Orpheus of London between 1660 and 1760. Purcell's and Handel's music is remarkable for its consistency, excellence, inventiveness and appeal. Purcell's vocal music sets the English language with a sensitivity no one has matched. Handel dominated the musical life of London for 50 years with his operas, oratorios and chamber music.

Music by John Blow, Giuseppe Sammartini and Carl Frideric Abel will complete the program.

The music will be performed by Jerry Curry, harpsichordist and Distinguished Professor Emeritus at the University of South Carolina; Jean Hein, Baroque recorder; Brittnee Siemon, mezzo-soprano; Timothy Hein, Baroque recorder and Gail Ann Schroeder, viola da gamba. The program will feature a variety of music for solo harpsichord, instrumental chamber music and voice with accompanying instruments.

A pre-concert conversation about the music to be performed will begin at 7:00 p.m., followed by the performance at 7:30 p.m. A reception of English tea and homemade scones in Wesley Hall will follow the concert. Tickets are \$12. Seniors tickets are \$10 and students are \$6. For more information, 256-8383, ext. 113.

It's that time of year again. The average telephone book contains some 1600 pages and weighs about 5 pounds. A ton of recycled paper saves 24 trees, 7000 gallons of water, 4100kw hours of electricity, and 3.3 cubic feet of landfill space.
