A Whisper in our Hearts

Sunday morning in my sermon I shared some thoughts about how we can chart our way through life's journey in the New Year.

I shared these words from Robert Frost:

*"I shall be telling this with a sigh
Somewhere ages and ages hence;
Two roads diverged in a wood, and I
Took the one less traveled by
And that has made all the difference."*

It does matter how we travel through life in the coming year. Sometimes the road less traveled leads to the greatest blessings. As we come to the beginning of a new year we have to decide how we will live our lives and what will guide us. Will we be open to the signs that lead us to follow God and his way even though it might be a road less traveled?

Howard Thurman in his book, *Meditations of the Heart* gives us some words that might help us to chart our path:

*"Sometimes in the stillness of the quiet
If we listen,
We can hear the whisper in the heart
Giving strength to weakness, courage to fear and
Hope to despair."*

If we hope to be guided in God's way this year we will need to be disciplined in giving God's voice an opportunity to whisper in our hearts. In order to do that we must be disciplined in our study of scripture, in our daily prayer life, in our habits of worship and in our service to others. Wisdom does not come from a closed mind, but a mind that is opened to God.

Don't take too lightly your decision to try a new way this year. Some will not understand, some might feel threatened, and some might even laugh. How tempted we are as Stephen Carter suggested in "Culture of Disbelief" to make our religion a hobby or at best an interest group.

I believe the challenge for us regardless of where we are on the journey is to be open to the guidance of Almighty God. That's the best advice I can give anyone.

Happy New Year. I look forward to seeing you Sunday as we allow God to lead us.
