## *Love a Stranger*

*At Shandon we are blessed with a number of volunteer telephone receptionists. We give thanks for the time and talent they share with our church. Our goal is that during church business hours no one should ever call our church and not be able speak to a human being.*

Don't you hate to call a business and get a voice recording: Press 1 for so and so. Press 2 for so and so. Press 3 for so and so. It seems most of the time the person I want is 9th or 10th on the list. Then you finally get the person you want and you are put on hold and for the foreseeable future you are trapped listening to music or a repeated recorded message until the person finally answers and you get a human voice. Call us a fast society or an efficient society, but don't call us a personal society.

Yet God wants his people to be an exception. Let everyone else go the way of computers and keyboards. God's children are called to be people of hospitality.

It is no accident that hospitality and hospital come from the same Latin word for they both speak of the same result: healing. When you issue a warm and friendly greeting to someone the message you send is "You matter to me and to God." You may think you are saying, "Hello," but you are really saying "You're worth the effort."

The ministry of hospitality is something the church must forever work on, improve on, and always be seeking to do better in our worship services, in the church hallway, in Sunday school classes, in any small group or any occasion where newcomers might enter our church.

The word hospitality compounds two terms: love and stranger. The word literally means to love a stranger. All of us can welcome a guest we know and love, but can we welcome a stranger?

One of the saddest things that can ever happen is for a stranger to attend a worship service, or a Sunday school class, or any small group within the church and not be greeted. These folks won't come back. So let's all make a commitment to looking for the strangers who come to Shandon, to going out of our way to welcome them, and to purposely make them a part of our fellowship group. That's something every one of us can do!!

I look forward to seeing all you Sunday morning as we look for the strangers in our midst.

Hurricanes, tornadoes, and other disaster events leave many families in need of shelter and other assistance. In response to our church's Vision and Strategic Plan, Shandon is forming an Early Response Team (ERT) to aid others in the Southeast when disaster strikes.

An ERT arrives on the scene to put tarps on roofs, clear fallen tree debris, and provide other cleanup work to help families recover more quickly. ERT members require training. Shandon's first training opportunity is Saturday, September 15, 9:00 a.m.-5:00 p.m. at Union UMC in Irmo, 7582 Woodrow Street. The training fee is \$35, plus an \$11.99 background check fee.
