- because of this their children and grandchildren are the tallest, brightest and best looking generation to inhabit the earth
- because they were materialistic we work fewer hours, learn more, travel to more distant places and have more chances to follow our ambitions
- they fought humankind's grisliest wars defending our freedom and came home heroes and when the wars were over they spent billions of dollars helping their former enemies rebuild their homeland
- they were/are the most Bible believing and church attending generation our country has ever known and they built churches in every community
- through the highest courts in the land they fought racial discrimination and broke down barriers of sexism

## ***In Memoriam of Betty Livingston Bruner given by Lesli Wood, August 25, 2010***

“Little children, let us love, not in word or speech,  
but in truth and action.” 1 John 3:18

*How many people who have told you about Christ have really changed your life? How many lectures or sermons do you remember that actually made a difference in your choices? I suspect that if we are honest, we'll discover that words are not what converted us or changed us or made a difference. For the words to take root, they had to be connected to someone we trusted, or we weren't likely to listen. In fact, the words were probably not as significant as the way the person lived. Cardinal Suhard, Archbishop of Paris in the 1940s wrote, “To be a witness does not consist in propaganda, nor even in stirring people up, but in being a living mystery. It means to live in such a way that one's life would not make sense if God did not exist.”*

I thank God today for the “living mystery” of Betty Bruner.

The portrait of Betty Bruner, that will hang in the History and Archives Room, was painted and contributed by the

artist/photographer Robin Damore, friend of Linda Burnside, a Shandon member and designer of the room. Robin works out of her Portland, Oregon studio located in the historic Pearl District Gadsby Building. Early in her career, Robin traveled through Europe and the United States, with her husband, creating photos of Paris, Provence, Italy, Manhattan, Philadelphia, Portland, Sonoma Valley, Oceanside and more. In 1998, Robin began drawing faces and discovered she had an ability to capture more than just a likeness. Looking at her work, people would describe it as “capturing the essence” – the soul of the subject. She began drawing everyday, took artist's anatomy classes and began drawing from live models. She worked primarily in pencil, charcoal and colored pencil and in 2000, she began painting portraits in oil by studying with a world renowned Russian master portrait artist and professor at the New York Art Students League, Leonid Gervits. He became a mentor, and Robin made a number of trips to New York City to study with him. She rented a studio and began working as a full time artist. Robin is a member in good standing of the American Society of Portrait Artists and the Portrait Society of America.

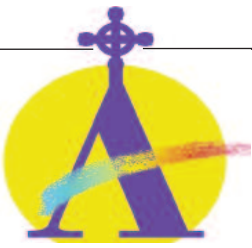
