Is the Picture Clear?

Imagine a puzzle with its pieces spread across a table. It takes every piece of that puzzle in its correct place to create the over all picture.

In the same way each of us is needed to help our church complete its picture and our church body is needed to fulfill the overall Body of Christ.

Now imagine one piece of the puzzle. It’s unique. There is no other one shaped exactly like it. Of course, there are some that look like it from afar. But when you try to place an individual piece, you see where it fits and where it doesn’t.

That puzzle piece links with every piece that surrounds it. It may touch a half dozen pieces all together. If it is not there, the pieces it is supposed to touch can’t fully realize their roles either. It’s not just that the overall picture isn’t clear; it is that it is fuzzy in the place where the piece is missing.

Could it be the same way with our church body? The overall picture isn’t clear when we are not there? Could it be that there are those who are directly affected by our absence? Are there those who we’re supposed to touch or team up with or inspire who go unfulfilled when we aren’t in our place?

So often we think about going to church because we need it, or because we want to be fed. Those are crucial parts of the church experience. But what about what we put into it? We are there to worship God and we should put our hearts fully into that. We also need to pour ourselves into reaching out to our brothers and sisters while we are at church. It may be as simple as a warm smile and hand shake to a member of the church or a visitor. It may be praying for someone, offering an encouraging word, or volunteering our time and talent to help do the work of the church.

Proverbs 27:17 tells us that we are like iron sharpening iron in each other’s lives. To put it another way the only way to get better at any sport is to consistently play with people who are better than you. It improves your game. Every single person in our lives can be used to push us closer to God. That is why all of us are important to one another as members of the Body of Christ. You are important; you bless and endow the lives of others. Make sure you are filling your place as part of the puzzle, as part of the Body of Christ.

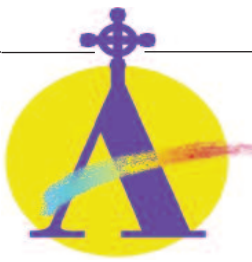
