Shandon History and Archives Room

On June 17, the Shandon UMC History and Archives Room will be dedicated in memory of Betty Livingston Bruner.

Betty was the ultimate historian and preserver of Shandon's great history. She was approached in 1954 by the new minister at Shandon, Bob DuBose, about coming back to work for the church as Christian Education assistant. Betty accepted his offer and began what became her life's work as Director of Christian Education at Shandon. She started the church's kindergarten and daycare programs, the Shandon Day Camp and was a charter member of the Good Will Sunday School Class. For more than 50 years, Betty touched, and was a part of, the lives of the young people who grew up in Shandon. After she retired, Betty remained a constant and valuable resource for Christian Education and workshops for the Methodist Conference. Music was always an important part of her life. She sang in choirs at Shandon her entire life and was a member of the first adult handbell choir. She continued to direct the kindergarten/children's choir after her retirement and taught Sunday school until just before her death. Betty was honored by the Shandon Churchwomen in 1972 and received the "Woman of the Year" award from them in 1994. Shandon named its education building in her honor in 1994 and rededicated it in her honor and to the service of God in 2009. Betty died August 25, 2010.

Betty retired from Shandon in 1994 but continued

her love of its history working on the archives regularly. In 2009 for the Centennial, she headed the history committee appointed by MaryAnn Crews, chair of the Centennial. Her committee compiled the history of Shandon's 100 years for the Collection of 100 Years of History, Art & Recipes.

Following the Centennial Celebration, Betty and Mike Guffee asked MaryAnn Crews to chair the History Committee. For two years, MaryAnn and the history committee have been hard at work on making Betty's dream of a History and Archives Room easily accessible to church members a reality. The room is full of interesting historical items. It is a lovely and comfortable place where members can spend hours looking through items that bring back many happy memories.

The room and Betty's portrait will be dedicated on June 17th with deep appreciation to the Bruner Family for allowing all of the memorials to Betty to be used to fund the room; to Barbara Cobb for providing the additional funds needed to complete the room; to Linda Burnside for offering her Interior Design expertise and facilities; to artist Robin Damore for the portrait of Betty, to the church staff for their help and to the past and present members of the History Committee for their dedication and hard work.

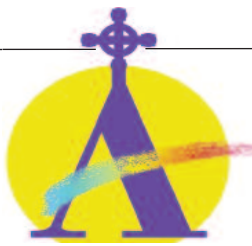
