After missing three Sunday mornings at Shandon, one for vacation and two for illness I can't wait till this coming Sunday morning.

Maybe it's the minister in me, but a Sunday without being in the company of God's people and encountering God in worship is greatly lacking. I know many of you share this feeling about the importance of being in church and worshipping on Sunday mornings.

June is going to be a great month for worship here at Shandon, and I hope you will plan to be present every Sunday morning for worship and church school.

We begin the month on **June 5** by gathering around the communion table and partaking of symbols of Christ body and blood. In essence, Holy Communion is a memorial service in which we remember Jesus sacrifice for the sins of the world, the cost of our forgiveness and God's great love for us. Holy Communion always renews our awareness of how deeply God loves us and calls us to give ourselves more fully to him.

Sunday, **June 12**, is Pentecost Sunday, the third great festival day of the church year. The service will focus on how the Holy Spirit is moving here at Shandon: how our lives are changed, whether dramatically or subtly, suddenly or gradually, by our encounter with the One who loves us as we are, but refuses to leave us that way. After the sermon members of our church will give a "cardboard testimony" as to how the Holy Spirit has brought about real and powerful change in their lives.

June 19 is Father's Day. Father's Day is not recognized in the Christian year but it is celebrated by most of us as we remember and give thanks for our fathers. Our worship service that day is going to focus on the family, the important role fathers and mothers play, and the important role of faith to our lives as we live together in families of all descriptions.

June 26 is Faith and Freedom Day at Shandon. The Faith and Freedom choir will present inspiring music at the 8:45 and 11:00 a.m. worship services as we remember and celebrate the blessings of our national freedom. We will recognize those who have served in the armed services and sing wonderful hymns celebrating God's blessings to our country. This is always a wonderful day and you don't want to miss it.

Worship is so important to our spiritual lives make sure you are in the company of God's people at Shandon as we worship each Sunday. I look forward to seeing each and every one of you!

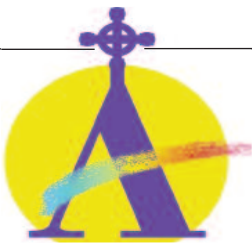

Going Green Tips from Shandon's Green Team

Many Household Cleaners Are Hazardous To Your Health and the Environment!

Your house may be "clean" and smelling good, but toxic household cleaners pose health risks to all of us – especially children. According to the EPA, we spend 90% of our time indoors and the indoor air we breathe is 5-10 times more toxic than outdoor air. A major contributor are toxic cleaners. We use household cleaners to freshen the air and clean our bathrooms, ovens, countertops, rugs, floors, clothes, dishes, windows, and for other common uses. The average American uses between 3-25 gallons of toxic chemicals annually for cleaning. Of the 25,000 chemicals found in household cleaners, only 3 out of 10 have been tested for effects on human health. Typical household cleaners contain toxic chemicals which may include, but are not limited to ammonia, phenol, cresol, lye, butyl, formaldehyde, petroleum distillates, benzene, and morpholine. They also include phosphoric, sulfuric and hydrochloric acids.

As an alternative, consider purchasing more eco-friendly cleaning products or consider making home recipe cleaning solutions.
