CONNECTING TO GOD

The offering is one component of worship on Sunday morning that you might not have thought of as an act of worship.

Many people, I am afraid, understand the offering as the church collecting money to pay its bills or as the church collecting dues. To go back a few decades people see the offering as paying the preacher. Many people never think of the offering as a “spiritual act of worship.”

Every time we receive the offering, we are giving visible, tangible expression to the materiality of the Christian faith. We are lifting up ordinary things like money and checks and saying that because of the life, teachings, death and resurrection of Jesus, these ordinary materialistic things take on a new significance for us. Jesus was always lifting up the everyday stuff of life and setting them in the context of God’s kingdom and thereby giving them spiritual significance.

In light of this, the offering on Sunday morning is a spiritual act of worship in which we connect our lives to God. How do we do this?

First, we remember the intellect and talents God has endowed us with and by which we go into the world to work. Think of the talents and gifts God has endowed you with that enable you to perform your job every day. We are all gifted in a variety of ways and those gifts were given to us by God at birth. Without them we could not do our jobs. During the offering we give thanks to God for our talents.

Secondly, during the offering we celebrate and give thanks to God for all the blessings of life. The Hebrew people received an offering once a year that was called a “thank offering.” This offering focused on the blessings that have come from God such as family, shelter, food, friends, etc. During the offering we remember that God is the giver of every good and perfect gift. As we place our gifts in the offering plate we give thanks for our all blessings.

Thirdly, the offering is a time to recommit ourselves to God and His mission in the world. The money we put in the offering plate supports God’s mission in the world. The offering is a good time for all of us to recommit ourselves to supporting God’s mission not just by giving money but by offering our time and talents to God.

Fourthly, the offering is the acid test of what we are about as the people of God. It yokes our faith, our jobs, our daily concerns and cares. The offering is an act of worship that typifies our peculiar Christian stance toward the world.

Whether you give your offerings weekly, monthly, quarterly, annually or even online the time of the offering is a time to connect with God spiritually in the above ways. I look forward to seeing you in worship Sunday. Each act of worship is a blessing and has a unique purpose in connecting us to God. -In Faith, Michael Guffee, Sr.

These soon-to-be Stephen Ministers are looking forward to being able to help members of our congregation.

If you are wanting/needing a compassionate person to listen to you (confidentially) as you go through a difficult time, please contact Rev. Carly Wicklund at 256-8383, ext. 102.

After being referred by the Referral Coordinator, the care receiver will be contacted by a Stephen Minister, who will meet with him/her one hour per week as long as they are needed.

SHANDON'S CHILD & YOUTH ABUSE PREVENTION PROCEDURES REMINDER OF THE MONTH: Reporting Suspected Abuse

Anyone associated with Shandon UMC who observes abuse, or has reason to suspect abuse, should immediately report these observations or suspicions directly to the Shandon UMC clergy person or staff director of the relevant program. The Senior Minister or Acting Senior Minister should be immediately contacted and will be personally responsible for executing the initial response procedures. Observe confidentiality for both the alleged victim and the accused throughout the investigation. The Senior Minister will be the church's sole spokesman with the media, public, and congregation.


Copies of Policy Key Points, Reporting Procedures, and Report Forms, as well as a list of approved volunteer workers, are available in wall slots in halls and areas designated for children and youth.
