- Our children will be learning the importance of serving those in need by making Blessings Bags for the homeless. Our children and their parents will meet in Player Hall at 9:00 a.m. to make bags and cards for the homeless.
- While our children are making Blessing Bags our older adults will be making shoes for the non-profit Sole Hope. We will be cutting out templates for shoes and sending them to Sole Hope to assemble and send to children in Uganda to prevent children from getting jiggers and infections in their feet. We can have up to Hall from 9:00-11:00 a.m.
- Across town we'll have 10 of our adults working on our Spring Interfaith Habitat for Humanity build. Please register through Habitat if you're interested in participating. If you have further questions about our Habitat build, contact Jennifer Parker at jpclemsongirl@gmail.com.
- Our youth will be at the Family Shelter working with the children of the residents or helping to maintain the property. We can have up to 30 youth at this site. We'll meet at the Family Shelter at 9:00 a.m.
- In order to support our United Methodist sisters, we'll be organizing storage areas at the Killingsworth Home for Children. This site is opened to any women over the age of 18 and does not require any prior training or skill.

Shandon Outreach 2016

2016 WAS ONCE AGAIN A BIG YEAR FOR OUTREACH AT SHANDON!

*Shandon members –
making a difference in
the lives of others.*

- Shandon sponsored a foreign mission team to El Salvador and seven church members were assisted with funding.
- Seven youth received partial funding to attend Salkehatchie Summer Service, a conference mission activity that is youth driven and helps South Carolinians with much needed home repairs.
- Outreach provided funding to assist three members with mission work in Japan, Nicaragua, and Tennessee, as well as support for the Attaways, Shandon's missionary family serving in Thailand.

- Shandon participated in a Lenten Rehab with Habitat for Humanity providing a home for Alisa and her two young boys. In addition to providing labor, \$20,000 was donated to purchase materials.
- Four blood drives were coordinated through the Red Cross and were held quarterly with each drive netting roughly 20 units and saving approximately 240 lives!
- Seeds of Hope Farmer's Market was open 19 Saturdays from mid-June until mid-October, providing 1333 customers with fresh produce and netting \$14,820.20.
- Each year Outreach partners with the youth of Shandon and our Kitchen Ministry Team to serve Thanksgiving dinner to the youth and direct-care staff at the Department of Juvenile Justice. In addition to food and fellowship, Lesli Wood shared an inspiring message of hope which included a personal story and remarks about her own faith journey, as well as the Good News of Jesus Christ! It was an amazing evening for our youth and all those at DJJ!
- Outreach members enjoyed worshipping at the Methodist Student Network at USC and serving a fabulous dinner to the students and faculty.
- Quarterly donations totaling \$62,800 were given to 15 different local agencies that provided food, shelter, after school care, medical care, education, and counseling to those in need.
- Through the Lenten Offering, an additional \$34,396.65 was given to support our clinics in Haiti, Imagine No Malaria, and Lighthouse for Life.
- Advent Offering totaled \$36,863.70 and was given to support our clinics in Haiti, Imagine No Malaria, Habitat, and Harvest Hope Food Bank.
- Primarily through Advent and Lenten Offerings, \$26,315.47 has been given to Imagine No Malaria, a Conference Initiative to eradicate malaria in sub-Saharan Africa. Shandon made a 3-year goal of \$30,000 and with more than a year left, we are almost there!
- Shandon Outreach also sponsored a virtual food drive for Harvest Hope and hosted a community awareness event about human trafficking in partnership with Lighthouse for Life, a local grass-roots organization seeking to combat sex trafficking through education, restoration, and empowerment. Lighthouse will open a safe house in July for girls 12-21 years old rescued from trafficking. This will be only the second safe house in South Carolina.
- Outreach dollars were also given to support the Aldersgate House, St. Lawrence Place's "Race for the Place," Oliver Gospel Mission's Thanksgiving dinner, The Women's Shelter "Thanksgiving Souper," Samaritan's Purse, Turning Pages, Shandon Cluster of Churches Helping Hands Committee, DJJ Epiphany weekends, Epworth Cookout for Kids, Epworth Back to School, and Epworth Christmas.

While this is not an all-inclusive list, it certainly provides a picture of the many ways Shandon members are touching others through the giving of financial gifts and hands-on gifts of service and love. May the Lord continue to bless us, may He be pleased and delighted with the way that we are using the gifts that He has entrusted to us, and may we give Him all the glory, honor, and praise!
