PRESENT & FAITH STRONG

I have read several articles recently about declining church attendance. It seems this is taking place across denominational lines.

The articles gave several reasons for this:

- **Lack of commitment to God and the church on the part of church members.**
- **Members don't understand that attendance is important.**
- **Church members attend less frequently because they have many things that take them away from church such as weekend trips, sporting events and children's activities.**

Let us think about these three individually.

First, there is a lack of commitment to God and the church on the part of church members. Think about your record of attendance at church on Sunday. There have already been 12 Sundays in 2015. On how many of those Sundays have you attended both Sunday school and worship? Think about this question, what does your record of attendance say about the importance of God in your life and your commitment to the ministry of God's church? Some people say, "I don't need to attend church to be a Christian." If that is so, then how do you nurture your faith? Few people are disciplined enough to provide adequate nurture for their faith by themselves. Attending church is a sign that God is important to your life. Sabbath keeping is to be in step with the way God intends the world to work. By attending church we align ourselves with God and His will for the world, and we witness to others that God and His church are important. Let's think hard about our attendance at church, what does it really say about our allegiance to God and His church?

Secondly, members don't understand that attendance is important. That one puzzles me. We all have taken a vow to support the church with our attendance. Attendance builds up the church and a lack of attendance tears down the church. How many people want to attend a church with a lot of empty seats? By being present, we help build up the church to a point of strength. We inspire our neighbors, our church leaders, and our fellow church members by regular and faithful church attendance. The strength of the church rises or falls according to the degree of our attendance. One reason we go to church is as service to God, service that is pleasing to ourselves and to God, but even when it is not pleasing to us, it is necessary for the world's salvation.

Thirdly, members attend less often because of the many things that take them away from church. Yes, we live in a busy world. There are more things to take people away from church today than there ever have been. But this raises a question: Among all the things that I can do on Sunday other than go to church which one of them nurtures and develops faith in God for me and my family? If we don't attend church it is likely that won't happen. According to the Barna Research Group, only 6 percent of children who are not Christian by age 18 will become Christians later in life. Which means that if we want our children to become spiritually mature they must be nurtured in the faith while growing up. Adults who have an active spiritual life have one thing in common; their parents took them to church week in and week out while they were growing up. Folks there is no substitute for regularly bringing your children to church.

Let me encourage you and your family to think about how often you attend church. During over 40 years in the ministry I have known a lot of people. The people who had a strong faith and who raised spiritually mature children and youth were at church most Sundays. How about you? -In Faith, Michael Guffee, Sr.

FIRST AID AND EMERGENCIES ON SHANDON CAMPUS

- First Aid Kits are located in each building hallway.
- Wheelchairs and walkers are located in the Bruner Building under the stairway going into the courtyard and in the Dunn-Smith Ministry Center under the stairway near Player Hall. If these items are used, please return them to these locations so they will be available when needed.
- Shandon has two Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs) if someone is having a heart attack. This device analyzes whether a victim's heart is beating and whether or not to deliver an electrical shock to reestablish a heart rhythm. AEDs are only to be used by CPR- and AED- trained persons. Our ministers, education staff and ushers are trained to use the AEDs. The devices are located in the Bruner Building first floor hall and in the Dunn-Smith Ministry Center hall by the First Aid kits.
- If someone is in need of medical assistance on the Shandon campus during the week or on Sundays, you may locate a minister, staff member or usher or if it is an emergency call 911.
