## *Growing-up*

*We all appreciate I Corinthians 13, Paul's chapter that goes on about that crazy thing called love:*

"Though I speak in the tongues of men and of angels and have not love, I am a sounding brass and a tinkling symbol." Paul continues, "Love bears all things, believes all things, hopes all things and endures all things...Love never fails." In the eleventh verse, Paul writes, "When I was a child, I spoke as a child, I understood as a child, I thought as a child, but when I became an adult, I put away childish things." Based on that verse, I believe love is for grownups.

Have you ever spent any time around small children? They repeat one word: mine! They never say it once. They say, "Mine, mine, mine!" For a mature grown up Christian there is no such thing as mine. Grownup Christians only speak of what God has shared with me. "All things come of thee O Lord and of thine own have we given thee."

This is not a popular idea in America and if we are honest not even in the church. In our world we look out for number one. We say, "I got mine you get yours." But the Christian is supposed to be different.

The grownup Christian knows every heartbeat is a gift. The portion of faith we enjoy is a gift. Every nickel we have is a gift. What do we have that is not a gift? Even my sins are not mine anymore, Christ has taken them away.

Because everything is a gift, we blaspheme when we cry mine. Or at least we sound childish. It takes a real grownup to admit that he or she is wrong. It takes a real grownup to hear an apology and move on. It is childish to brood and pout, waiting around for people to notice what you are not grown up enough to say.

In another letter, Paul says that "...unity, faith, and knowledge of the Son of God are maturity." The point, of course, is as we "grow into the full stature of Christ," Christ's ministry in the world is multiplied. And as the world sees, "that we are no longer like children, the world might be inclined to hear about how we achieved this growth."

Maybe our prayer should be, "God hasten the day when we put away childish things." See you Sunday morning in Sunday school and worship at the growing-up place.
