Do Unto Others

“You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lampstand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven.” Matthew 5:14-16

We’re all familiar with the command: “Do unto others as you would have them do unto you.” This statement is found in many of the world’s religions. But today, let’s concentrate on the first word – DO. Last week, at our Ash Wednesday services, everyone was asking, “What are you giving up for Lent?” Many of us are choosing to live for forty days without sweets or sodas, even though we acknowledge that our sacrifice of going for a few weeks without candy does not compare with the sacrifice of Jesus.

Instead of giving up sweets or sodas, perhaps this year we should ask, “What can I DO during Lent that would be more in keeping with the life and teachings of Jesus Christ?” If each one of us during this Lenten season DID just one thing each day for others it might make Jesus much happier than seeing us deprive ourselves of a Hershey bar or a Diet Coke.

I’d like to suggest that each day we do one good deed for someone and mark it down on a calendar. Then on Easter Sunday – look at your records and be astonished at all the good you have done in the name of Jesus. Here are some thoughts to get you started...

- Make a phone call to someone you haven’t been in contact with in years. Perhaps an old neighbor or distant relative or college classmate.
- Ask a waitress to bring you the check of a person in a restaurant who looks in need of a smile, and deliver to them one of Shandon’s “Share the Love” cards. You received two cards with your Lenten Offering letter, and we’ve got plenty more at church if you run out!
- Write an old fashioned pen & paper note to someone who is sick, lonely, or alone. They will love getting mail that is not asking for a donation.
- Give a couple hours of your time at a local agency such as Harvest Hope, The Cooperative Ministry or the Salvation Army. They always need volunteers.
- Visit someone in a hospital, nursing home, or retirement facility. It can be short & sweet – you’d be amazed at the power of a smile or a hug.

Finally, PRAY that God will open your eyes, heart, and mind to see those in need all around you, and give you the guidance to do unto others as you would have them do unto you.
