# Be Still, and Know that I am God Psalm 46:10

*A friend recently loaned me a book, The Simple Faith of Mr. Rogers. The title intrigued me, and I realized that I really miss Fred Rogers (an ordained minister, by the way) and “Mr. Rogers’ Neighborhood.” You may remember that each episode opened with a traffic light flashing in yellow caution mode. The image in that opening shot was the very essence of the episode’s message: It’s time to slow down. In the book, Fred Rogers says, “For me, being quiet and slowing down is being myself, and that is my gift.”*

In our culture today there are not many advocates of slowing down. We have grown so accustomed to the fast pace and fast images all about us until we feel that slowing down is in direct contrast to these days in which we live. I believe that Mr. Rogers was right on target when he advised us to take our time and slow down. Fred Rogers was also an advocate for silence. He encouraged silence that was not simply the absence of noise, but silence that reflected God’s grace and the goodness of His handiwork.

I believe Mr. Rogers heard God speak to him just as God spoke to the Psalmist centuries ago saying, “Be still, and know that I am God.” In one of my favorite hymns, “Take Time to be Holy,” we sing these words: “Take time to be holy, the world rushes on; spend much time in secret with Jesus alone. By looking to Jesus, like Him you shall be; thy friends and thy conduct His likeness shall see.”

During Lent we begin a journey of discovering our inner relationship with ourselves and with God. Over the years, Lent became a season where we “gave up” coffee or chocolate, because Jesus gave up his life for our salvation. This challenge during Lent allowed us to discover if we could live for six weeks without one of our favorite vices, and hopefully gain important knowledge about our relationship with Jesus Christ. And yet Lent is truly a time of reflection about our relationship with Jesus Christ.

**I want to personally invite you to prepare your hearts for Lent by joining us at Shandon for one of our two Ash Wednesday worship services. Come on March 9 for morning worship at 7:30 a.m. (a crossing guard will help you get to the sanctuary safely) or worship with us at 6:15 p.m. following the food and fellowship of Wednesday Manna. During the coming Lenten season, I challenge you to “be still and know God.” My prayer is that you will be filled with all the joy, strength and wisdom that come with that experience!**
