Parents, It's Up to You

According to the Barna Research Group, only about 6 percent of people who are not Christians by the age of eighteen will become Christians later in life. Which indicates that if we want our children to become spiritually mature Christians in adulthood we need to give great importance to nurturing them in the Christian faith while they are growing up.

Adults who have an active spiritual life tend to have one thing in common. Their parents or another significant adult talked about the faith with them, practiced the faith in front of them, and took them to Sunday school and worship regularly when they were growing up.

Parents have a great responsibility in regard to their children's spiritual development. What we so often forget is that inside each little child is a soul. The soul is important for it provides us with a moral compass, it is the part of our being that brings us into relationship with the one who created us and all things, the one in whom life begins and life ends. As St. Augustine once said, "Our hearts are restless until our souls find rest in God."

There is no quick and easy solution to providing our children with a spiritual foundation. There is no injection that will produce instant faith. There is no vitamin that will provide immediate spiritual grounding. Spiritual nurture takes place over the approximately 18 years we have our children.

Therefore, parents must have conversations with their children about the Christian faith and faith's importance to our lives. Often these conversations are stimulated by children as they ask spiritual questions. Listen to their questions and do your best to answer them. Make sure you have regular times of prayer with your children. Meal time and bed time are perfect times to teach them to pray. Teach them to trust and rely upon God.

Secondly, practice the faith in the presence of your children. Let them see you praying, reading the Bible, taking a meal to a sick friend, or volunteering to help carry out the ministry of the church. Use Biblical principles when solving family conflicts. Let your light shine before your children.

Thirdly, attend Sunday school and worship regularly. Children will not attend church unless their parents bring them. The church can offer a wide variety of wonderful programs designed to nurture children in the faith, but children will not attend unless their parents bring them. We can bring our children to the baptismal font but they won't come to church unless parents bring them.

Parents who do these three things have the best chance of raising spiritually mature children. I look forward to seeing all of you in church on Sunday morning.
