Grace and Truth.

A recent e-newsletter from the Lewis Center for Leadership offers four helpful ideas for discipleship in the 21st century (taken from a blog by the Rev. Carey Nieuwhof) ...

Be a Confessor in a Culture of Blame: It's so easy to point the finger at someone else. Imagine what would happen if Christians owned the racism, sexism, and other isms that live in our hearts. Imagine what might happen if we confessed that we have not adequately loved people who are different than us. It's so easy to believe you're right and everyone else is wrong. But you are not always right. And you don't hold a monopoly on truth. Your perspective and mine are flawed. None of us loves perfectly or deeply enough.

Foster Conversation in a Culture that Shouts: Thanks to social media, everybody has a platform. A ridiculous number of people use theirs to shout rather than to listen. Conversations seem to be devolving into an exchange of monologues between people who don't seem terribly interested in each other.

What's missing in the current culture? Listening. Thoughtfulness. Humility. Kindness. Openness. Genuine, authentic conversation features all those elements and more. When was the last time you had a genuine conversation with someone who doesn't share your values – a conversation in which you listened as much as you spoke and tried to understand more than you tried to be understood. Love listens; so should Christians.

Broker Meaning in the Age of Information: Information used to be rare. You had to ask. Find an expert. Pull an encyclopedia off the shelf. The last decade has fundamentally changed that. Now we have more information than we know how to process. We have a million springs of endless information and we have no idea what it all means.

This provides a huge opportunity for the church. There's a generation of people looking for love in a world of hate, looking for truth in an age of relativity, looking for something to cling to when everything else seems to be falling apart. Jesus provides this framework of meaning.

Be the Counterculture: If there were ever a time for the countercultural message of Christianity to offer a real alternative, this is it. When the church simply reflects the social or moral values of an increasingly post-Christian culture, we echo the current emptiness; we don't echo God.

Jesus is the embodiment of grace and truth. The challenge, of course, is that most of us instinctively lean toward either grace or truth. It seems easier, but it's incomplete and wrong. Neither reflects the heart of God. Christ is truth and grace majestically woven together. Fusing grace and truth is an exceptionally difficult venture and is usually only successful when you spend significant amounts of time in prayer. But when you see grace and truth fused, it takes your breath away. In Christ, people experience the fusion of grace and truth every heart most deeply longs for. - Grace and peace, Smoke

Reminder of the Month: Reporting Suspected Abuse

"In the event of suspected abuse, staff and volunteers are required to report the incident following the church's reporting policy. Anyone associated with Shandon UMC who observes abuse, or has reason to suspect abuse, should immediately report these observations or suspicions directly to the Shandon UMC clergy person or staff director of the relevant program."

Copies of Policy Key Points, Reporting Procedures, and Report Forms, as well as a list of approved volunteer workers, are in wall slots in halls and areas where children are cared for. Substitutes and "fill-in" workers with children must be on this list.
