# Faith Can Guide Us

On November 6, our country will have a national election. I hope you plan to vote.

Voting is one of the unique privileges that comes with being part of a democracy. We have an opportunity and responsibility to choose our government leaders. Our choices are very important and each of us must vote according to the dictates of our mind and heart.

While I have never tried to tell anyone how to vote, I have on occasion urged members of my churches to give serious thought and prayer regarding what I deem to be social issues. Voters in Richland County will have such a choice on November 6 when we vote on a referendum that proposes to increase county sales tax by one penny on the dollar. Twenty eight percent of this tax increase would be allocated for continued operation of mass transit services provided by Central Midlands Regional Transit Authority including service improvements.

Each day 6800 people use the bus system. These people have no other way to get to work, post-secondary education, medical appointments or shopping. Most of these people are the working poor or near poor. The average income of bus riders has been determined to be \$16,500 a year. Currently, CMRTA provides no signage to help riders negotiate bus schedules and it provides no place to sit and no shelter for those waiting for the bus. Because of this, the only people who ride the bus are those who have no other options.

The critical issue here is that if voters don't approve the transportation referendum, County Council has no "Plan B" and funding for the bus system will terminate at the end of the current fiscal year unless emergency measures are put in place.

As Christians this is an issue we must consider seriously and carefully. We are called to love our neighbors and we are called to do unto others as we would have them do for us. Jesus taught us time and time again to be advocates for the poor and disadvantaged.

Now is our time to decide, like the men on the road to Jericho, will we stop and help bus riders or we will pass them by on the other side of the road.

This referendum is about more than dollars and cents it is about our taking care of the poor in our midst. As Christians I believe our faith can guide us in our decision on the referendum. Please give serious thought and prayer to this issue.

I look forward to seeing all you Sunday morning for All Saints Sunday.

# **GREAT DAY AT SHANDON: COMMITMENT SUNDAY**

Sunday, October 28, was an extraordinary day for Shandon. We watched as members of our church by the hundreds came streaming forward to place their commitment cards in support of our church's ministry in 2013 in the Joash Chest. It was a powerful and moving display of generosity and commitment to Shandon's ministry, and the results were impressive. Last year, on Commitment Sunday we received 180 commitment cards and this year we received 270 cards. Last year, the total committed on Commitment Sunday was \$1,010,965 and this year \$1,431,444 was committed. This is overwhelming good news, and this significant growth is credited to two things. First, prayer was a significant part of our campaign; truly God heard our prayers and deserves glory and praise. Secondly, we had a high level of participation, sacrifice and determination from our members.

As good as the results were Sunday we still have a ways to go as we need commitments in excess of \$2 million dollars to fund our 2013 church budget. # Shandon's Strategic Plan

In September 2011, Shandon's Church Council approved a strategic plan for our church.

The plan consists of 12 initiatives which are listed below. During the past year a task force has been elected to address the goals of each initiative. The majority of them have been meeting this year to implement the plan. The last several task forces will begin their work in early 2013. More information on our progress will be offered in the coming months.

- Explore partnering with a local United Methodist Church for redevelopment and renewal.
- Establish an additional worship service, at a different time and in a different style.
- Strengthen its current worship services with more participatory components.
- Engage in hands-on missional ministry at a much higher level with its two local Signature ministries: Epworth Childrens Home and The Family Shelter
- Establish and implement an Early Response Team (ERT).
- Expand its preschool ministry to include a full day and year round ministry.
- Explore the need for professional level pastoral counseling in the community and will consider how best to meet the need.
- Use its kitchen facilities in an expanded way to minister to the needs of this community.
- Ask every Shandon disciple to be involved in at least one Christian Education activity annually, beginning in September 2012.
- Ask every Shandon disciple to be involved in at least one missional ministry annually, beginning September 2013.
- Strengthen its young adult ministry to become a comprehensive ministry.
- Develop and implement a "Stewardship of Life" initiative.

# DID YOU KNOW? A FEW FACTS ABOUT THE SC NATIVE AMERICAN INDIAN

- The American Indians have long established belief in one GOD and have used the Cross as a sacred symbol long before the arrival of Whites
- The SC Native American's are sometimes known as the "invisible" people
- The SC Native American Indian people are members of the SC United Methodist Conference
- Before 2003 there were no state recognized Indian tribes in SC, as of today there are 11 State recognized tribes and 1 Federally recognized tribe (Catawba Indian Nation)
- The American Indians are the first people of SC, yet they are the last people to achieve voting rights (1948)
- There are more than 40,000 indigenous American Indians living in SC
- As high as 90% of the Indian communities live in poverty
- Over 30% of the Indian homes lack toilets and half do not have telephones
