Keeping our Ministry Strong

Yesterday was an exciting day as large numbers of Shandon members came to the altar and presented their Stewardship Re-Commitment Booklets.

In doing so they re-committed themselves to supporting the church with their prayers, presence, gifts, service and witness. Over a million dollars were committed to our 2012 church budget and 90% of those returning re-commitment booklets also returned a completed Time and Talent form.

We now have two financial issues to deal with as a church family as we look to the end of the year. **First, we must successfully complete our stewardship program.** If you were not able to be a church yesterday please return your Re-Commitment Booklet this week and help our church complete this effort. Our Stewardship Committee has in place a follow-up campaign consisting of mailing another booklet to those we have not heard from during the week of November 13. **Please save your church the expense of mailing another booklet by returning your Re-Commitment Booklet by November 13.** The final part of follow-up will begin on December 6 when Stewardship Committee members begin making phone calls to members we have not heard from. Let us all support the ministry of our church by promptly returning our Re-Commitment booklets.

A second financial issue is successfully completing 2011 on a strong financial note. During the first five months of 2011 Shandon saw increased giving to our operating budget. However, as the economy began to slow in late summer we saw a decline in giving. We now have a giving deficit compared to what was given through ten months of the year in 2010. During November and December we must overcome this deficit and finish in the black. Please look carefully at your giving through October and if you are behind in your giving, please try to catch up as soon as possible.

The ministry of Shandon touches numerous lives each week. It is imperative that we keep our church strong financially so that our ministry remains strong and vital.

I look forward to seeing you at church on Sunday for a very special All Saints Day worship service. Blessings on each of you!!
