*In this season of* stewardship emphasis leading up to Commitment Sunday on October 25, I am reminded of a story about Maxey Jarman, founder of the great Genesco shoe chain. Over the years Mr. Jarman made a lot of money. As a Christian layman he supported many worthy causes including the church he belonged to and many charities. He freely and joyously gave his money to benefit God's work in many places.

But the day came when his company collapsed and with it, his personal fortune. Someone asked him, "Mr. Jarman, don't you regret giving all that money away? Think what a difference it would make if you had it all back." To which he replied, "On no, I don't regret any of the money I have given away. After all I only lost what I kept for myself."

Jarman's words are an expression of Jesus's words in Matthew 6:19-21, "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, where moth and rust consume and where thieves break in and steal; but store up for yourselves treasures in heaven, where neither rust nor moth consumes and where thieves do not break in and steal. For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also."

The early church always lovingly cared for the poor, the sick, the distressed, the helpless, and those for whom no one else cared. In the days of great persecution in Rome, the Roman authorities broke into the Christian Church. Their goal was to loot the treasures which they believed the church possessed. The Romans demanded from Laurentius, the deacon: "Show me your treasures at once." Laurentius pointed at the widows and orphans who were being fed, the sick being nursed, and the poor whose needs were being supplied, "There," he said, "are the treasures of the Church." The Church has always believed that "what we keep, we lose, and what we give we have."

Jesus stated the truth that where a person's treasure is, there his heart is also. Jesus never said that this world was unimportant; but he said and implied over and over again that its importance is not in itself, but in that to which it leads. This world is not the end of life, it is a stage on the way; and therefore a person should never lose their heart to this world and the things of this world, for our eyes should be forever fixed on the world beyond.

As we pray about what we will put on our Stewardship Commitment Card in preparation for October 25, let us think about where our treasure is. Remember we only lose what we keep, what we give away is eternal.
