We now move into the month of October and at Shandon this will be a month of inspiration and opportunity.

We begin with World Communion Sunday on October 5 as we join Christians from all over the world at the table or our Lord.

At Shandon, we will go back to a former way to serve the elements as we kneel at the altar to receive the communion. When there is an open place at the communion rail, kneel and hold out your open hands and you will be served. Stay and pray silently and when you finish get up and return to your seat. As you pray, remember your brother and sister church members around the world and pray for the unity of Christ's holy church. We also will be happy to hear our children's choirs at the 11:00 a.m. traditional service.

On October 12, we will begin our fall stewardship emphasis. Our worship service will be designed around the theme of prayer that God might guide us as we make our financial commitments in support of our 2015 church budget. I have always heard that "a church budget is a statement of faith about what we really believe about God and the importance of the ministry of His church." During our stewardship program we will have stewardship moments each Sunday given by our laity.

On October 19, we will receive our Trek Discipleship Class as new members of Shandon. Plan to be present to welcome these new members of our church family. Also at the 11:00 a.m. traditional worship service, we will be blessed to have the Claflin College Choir fill our choir. I have hosted them in the last two churches I have served and they are outstanding. Get ready to hear some spirit moving music. I assure you, you don't want to miss this opportunity. Claflin, one of our four United Methodist senior colleges in South Carolina, is located in Orangeburg.

Then on October 26, we will continue with our stewardship emphasis. On this Sunday, our worship service will be designed around the importance of tithing. Tithing was commenced by Abraham, continued by Jacob, commanded by Moses, and commended by Jesus. Tithing, giving ten percent of our income to God, is still the most sensible plan of giving. Also on October 26, we will present our third graders with their first Bible. This has been a longstanding tradition of the church. Many of us can remember this important time in our life.

October is going to be an important and inspirational month. Make sure you are in worship each Sunday. I look forward to greeting each of you.
