Dr. Ron Prier

A LOOK AT SHANDON'S YOUTH PRAYER DISCUSSION

The youth group took at three-week look at prayer during UMYF. They started by discussing prayer in general and moved to looking at the various types of prayer. They finished by discussing how we can become answers to our own prayers and the prayers of others. Using Shane Claiborne's 50 Ways to Become the Answer to Our Prayers as a reference and idea-starter, the youth developed many ways that they could become an answer to prayer in their own context (whether that be among friends, at school, and at home).

Some of the youth's ideas:

Grow vegetables and give them away, Give away our bikes, Stick candy in people's lockers, Bring your friends to help volunteer with you volunteer places, Become a pen pal with someone at DJJ, Take shorter/colder showers, Visit the unvisited, Mow your neighbor's grass, Babysit for free every once in a while, Buy used clothes the next time you need a new pair of pants or a shirt, Introduce yourself to one person you do not know at school once a week for five weeks, Create a bag of supplies for a homeless person and leave it in your car ready to give out, Give a student that walks home a ride
